



On November 11, 1918, World War I ended with an armistice agreement and has been celebrated ever since. In 1926 Congress passed a resolution to observe this "war to end all wars" with a holiday "to commemorate with thanksgiving and prayer and exercises designated to **perpetuate peace through good will and mutual understanding between nations**."

"After World War II ... Armistice Day was flipped from a day for peace into a day for displays of militarism. ... We want generations after us to never know the destruction war has wrought on people and the earth." (Veterans for Peace, http://bit.ly/VFPArmisticeDay). Veterans for Peace has taken the lead in lifting up the original intention of November 11th as a day for peace. The Peace Alliance National Department of Peacebuilding Campaign stands with Veterans for Peace and others in honoring the original intention of November 11th.

We need a Department of Peacebuilding to:

- Focus comprehensively on **preventing violence** domestically and internationally
- Save lives and money as nonviolence is proven practical and cost effective
- Expand civilian capacity for peacebuilding and nonviolent conflict intervention
- Promote and fund the many community-based violence prevention "best practices"
- Uniformly teach violence prevention & mediation skills to America's school children
- Address root causes of terrorism to enhance homeland security
- Support the military with complementary approaches & post conflict reconstruction

Over one hundred years ago the world celebrated peace as a universal principle. The first World War had just ended and nations mourning their dead collectively called for an end to all wars. Armistice Day was born and was designated as "a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated." Veterans -- and others -- know that a day that celebrates peace, not war, is the best way to honor the sacrifices of veterans. Turning that day of peace into a way of life -- a culture of peace -- is the best way to honor the sacrifices of veterans and to celebrate the work of peacebuilders.

Veterans For Peace and the Campaign for a Department of Peacebuilding call on the U.S. public and our legislators to say no to more war and to demand justice and peace, at home and abroad.
